The image shows an adult female white widow spider, *Latrodectus pallidus*, climbing out of her web. In our study in the Negev Desert, we found that white widow spider egg sacs are more parasitized and a better host for parasitoid wasps, *Philolema latrodecti*, compared to egg sacs of the globally invasive brown widow spider, *Latrodectus geometricus*. aggression, and sociality, but it is unclear whether animals display personality across additional behavioral domains. We investigated the generality of personality across spatial behaviors such as home-ranging, movement through space, and habitat use. We demonstrated that individuals consistently differed in these behaviors across taxa. The existence of spatial personality may influence wildlife distribution, abundance, interactions, and fitness, and thus effect the capacity
